1 A N N A C A M P B E L L, after having been duly sworn, was
2 examined and testified as follows:

3 EXCERPT OF DIRECT EXAMINATION BY ATTY. TAMACCIO:

4 Q As you sit here today October the 5th, 2021, do you
5 recall either sending or receiving these seventy emails?

6 A Yes, I do.

7 Q Other than the physical manner in which they are
8 presented, the fact that they are printed out, has the
9 content of those emails changed in any substantial way since
10 you either authored or received them in the summer of 2018?

11 A Not that I can tell.

12 Q Does the contents of State's exhibit 1 for ID fairly
13 and accurately depict email correspondence between yourself
14 and Mr. Lawrence in the summer of 2018?

15 A Yes.

16 ATTY. TAMACCIO: Your Honor, the State moves
17 that this be admitted as a full exhibit.

18 THE COURT: Is there an objection?

19 THE DEFENDANT: May I -- may I see the evidence,
20 please?

21 THE COURT: Yes.

22 ATTY. TAMACCIO: Your Honor, again, I've
23 provided this, there is a copy right here. Mr.
24 Lawrence keeps trying to give it back to me.

25 THE DEFENDANT: I want to see the document that
26 was given to the witness.

27 THE COURT: All right.

1 ATTY. TAMACCIO: If I may I'll recover it
2 myself.

3 THE COURT: They can count you out for short
4 stop for the Yankees, I guess.

5 ATTY. TAMACCIO: Oddly enough, Judge, I'm
6 usually the catcher.

7 (Pause)

8 THE COURT: Gentlemen, could we move this along,
9 please. I understand, Mr. Lawrence, you got a copy
10 of this in advance. We'll give you a little bit
11 longer but you're going to have to tell me whether
12 you object or not.

13 (Pause)

14 THE COURT: All right, Gentlemen. Is there an
15 objection to State's 1 for ID? Mr. Lawrence, you had
16 a copy of this. I let you look at this for quite a
17 bit of time and consult with Mr. Williams. You
18 object to the exhibit, yes or no?

19 THE DEFENDANT: I object to certain pages that
20 are irrelevant.

21 THE COURT: Well, you can voir dire on whether
22 it's admissible or not, but this is not cross-
23 examination, so you can object -- you've objected.
24 You want to voir dire, go ahead regarding the
25 particular pages you are talking about. But again,
26 this is not cross-examination at this point.

27 What are you objecting to -- which pages are you

1 objecting to?

2 THE DEFENDANT: May I be heard in absence of the
3 jury?

4 THE COURT: No. No.

5 THE DEFENDANT: I object right now to pages 24
6 and 26.

7 THE COURT: Based on -- 24 and 26 based on what?
8 If you're saying that those aren't authentic, you can
9 cross-examine -- not cross-examine -- voir dire on
10 that point.

11 THE DEFENDANT: Once again, could I be heard in
12 the absence of the jury?

13 THE COURT: No, for the second time.

14 THE DEFENDANT: Would Your Honor look at it and
15 would you then see to why I object?

16 THE COURT: What is your objection?

17 THE DEFENDANT: It is, it is basically something
18 that's taken out of context. And is not relevant to
19 the relative issue. The relative --

20 ATTY. TAMACCIO: If I may --

21 THE COURT: You could -- you don't need to. You
22 can cross-examine on those points and what you say
23 goes to weight, not admissibility. Since you're not
24 -- you don't appear to be contesting the authenticity
25 of the documents, they're admitted full exhibit.
26 Continue.

27 ATTY. TAMACCIO: Thank you, Your Honor. May I

1 recover the exhibit from counsel so I can continue
2 the examination.

4 EXCERPT OF CONT. DIRECT EXAMINATION BY ATTY. TAMACCIO:

5 Q If you would please turn your attention to page 24.
6 Just let me know when you get there.

7 A Yes, I'm here.

8 Q Would you please read email 24 to the jury?

9 A On Wednesday, September 5th, 2018, James Lawrence
10 sent me dot, dot, dot because the Jewish Zionist Deep State
11 is trying to set me up. And are using their power with the
12 FBI and cops to put me in jail. That -- that is why I told
13 you before I thought, smiley face.

14 Q Is that an email sent to you by James Lawrence?

15 A Yes, it is.

16 Q Do you recall receiving that email?

17 A Yes, I do.

18 Q How did you feel when you got that email?

19 THE DEFENDANT: Oh, God.

20 ATTY. TAMACCIO: Your Honor.

21 THE COURT: Mr. Lawrence, Mr. Lawrence.

22 THE DEFENDANT: Yes.

23 THE COURT: Stop making comments like the one
24 you just made. I don't want to hear
25 anything from you. If you have an objection, say so.

26 Don't make any editorial comments about the
27 witness's testimony. Understood?

1 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

2 Q I'll ask the question, again. Ms. Campbell, when you
3 received this email how did you feel?

4 A One, not surprised, but you know scared. It's just I
5 don't know who this Zionist -- Jewish Zionist Deep State is
6 and their power, but you know -- thank you.

7 Q When you received this email, were you concerned for
8 your own safety?

9 A Yes, as I've mentioned before.

10 Q And again, that email was on September the 5th,
11 correct?

12 A Correct.

13 (Pause)

14 Q Ms. Campbell, I'd like to move along a little bit in
15 the interest of time. During your email exchanges with Mr.
16 Lawrence, at any point did you -- allow me -- at any point
17 did you ask him to stop emailing you?

18 A Many times, yes.

19 Q At this point during this email exchange during the
20 time relating to this email exchange are you and Mr.
21 Lawrence communicating by a method other than email?

22 A No.

23 Q So the document that we're going through right now is
24 an exhaustive list of your communications with yourself and
25 Mr. Lawrence from August 22 -- excuse me -- August 21 to
26 September 22, correct?


27 A Correct. 'Cause I understood he was in Europe.
